5. The ladder tapes may be twisted or caught around the tape drum. Use needle-nose pliers to untangle the cords.







7. If the ladders are detached from the tape drum, use needle-nose pliers to retrieve the ladder cord. Slide ladder cord back into the tape drum slots.



8. Tilt the slats to make sure the blind operates properly.
